Welcome to the January edition of the Central Coast Leagues Club Bridge Club Newsletter

The festive season has come to a close; for those members of our club that want to compete at a higher level the ABF Summer Festival of Bridge in Canberra beckons followed by the 49th QBA Gold Coast Congress at the end of February. Wherever you are playing I hope that you will be polite to both your partner and the opposition and I wish you the best of luck; that all your finesses work and that those dodgy slams roll home!

When this club was formed in 1987 it was responsible for the collection of the Bridge Club annual membership fee and, where necessary, the ABF and NSWBA affiliation fees. The Leagues Club took over this responsibility for some years but now that their membership fee is to be paid in the month of the member's birth it is now our responsibility. We have to pay affiliation fees of \$8 per 'Home Club' member to the NSWBA by the end of January based upon our 'Home Club' membership at the end of October 2009. Then we have to pay \$12 per 'Home Club' member to the ABF in early April based upon our 'Home Club' membership at the end of March. The Treasurer, with help from committee members and directors, has been collecting the renewals since the start of December and so far about half of the membership has renewed. This means

that we have collected enough money to pay the NSWBA before the end of January for our current membership - if we pay after the end of January we would have to pay an extra dollar per member. Colin Mitchell, President.

The McCutcheon Trophy is awarded at the end of each calendar year to the player who accumulates the highest total of masterpoints during the calendar year. Nobody from our area has ever come anywhere near winning it but there are also awards for each rank and sometimes local players get a mention. This year Louis Koolen ran eighth in the National Masters list with 93.50 mps; in the Gold Life Masters list Garry Clarke ran third with 166.46, and Shirley Crockett ran tenth with 126.66.

Hand from the New Years Cup

Board 5, N/S vul, Dealer N.

I was sitting East and picked up this hand: ♠KQ853 ♥K9 ♠KJT ♣T98. With 12 HCP and a balanced hand I opened one spade. LHO bid two hearts and MFP (My Favourite Partner) responded with four spades. This is not a 'shutout' bid but as I had a minimum hand I passed. LHO led the heart queen and as MFP placed dummy on the table she muttered something like "don't make too many". Of course I did as the full hand was:

I won the heart in hand; drew trumps (didn't take long did it?), played the heart ace, trumped a heart and led a club. This was won by South who, after looking at dummy which contained only trumps and diamonds led a diamond giving me the twelfth trick. A club return would have been safer and given me the task of finding the diamond Queen. Given the bidding I

would have placed the diamond queen with South and led the diamond jack, ducking in dummy if the queen was not played by South.

The slam had only been bid and made once by Gwen White & Graham Winder. A combined 24 HCP with a singleton in one of the hands will not usually give twelve tricks, despite the superb trump fit. With 11 trumps the theory is that there will be eleven tricks.
