The Annual General Meeting and Annual Dinner (free to Club members) will be held on Friday 31 March.

The NSWBA has also approved a \_weekend congress, on 22/23 April. On the Friday there will be a walk-in pairs event, for those who feel a full weekend is too daunting.

The next committee meeting will be held on 20 Feb 1989. For those who have not heard the news yet, the NSWBA recently issued some additions to their Tournament Regulations, which will—be incorporated in our own regulations as soon as practicable. The main points are:

- 1. All partnerships are required to complete a standard NSWBA System Card and have it available on the table at all times for the benefit of their opponents. Each member of the partnership is to play the same system.
- 2. At the start of a round players should consult their opponents' System Card to ascertain:
  - the basic system being played
  - the length of each suit opening
  - the strength of the 1 NT opening
  - the strength of the suit openings at the 2 level

This is to reduce the risk of the transfer of unauthorised information e.g. if an opponent opens 1 NT and you pause to check/ask about the strength then you are deemed to have conveyed unauthorised information.

In the December issue of "Australian Bridge" I was appalled to read that of all the bridge players in this country only 2,500 members get this bi-monthly magazine. It is a

well-produced and well-respected magazine all over the world, with bridge problems, national and international news, results of congresses, and some witty columns to give you the odd chuckle or two.
