There were ten tables this time and the competition was stronger than that in Las Vegas. A very pleasant game which started at 7 pm and finished just after 10 pm. No problems this time with our different methods! Their 'session management' methods are somewhat different to ours; a nonplaying director for all sessions, the lead is not shown on the scoresheet, a pickup slip is completed at each table for each round (as well as the travelling scoresheets). The director collects the pickup slips at the end of each round and enters the scores on the computer so that the result is available about five minutes after the end of play (i.e. a 'manual' Bridgemate). This time we could only manage fourth place.



- **2** on board 15 and prepared to open two diamonds when RHO opened one no trump. I passed and after some very deep thought my LHO bid five diamonds. Wendy passed and RHO bid six diamonds which was passed out. Thirteen tricks later NS were trying to work put how to bid the grand – the hands being

with the spade king onside. As only two other pairs bid the slam they had a pretty good score. On board 31 we managed a good score:

The bidding went something like:

Wendy made nine tricks on a diamond lead by leading up to the club king for a top score of -50. One other EW pair played in five spades doubled for – 300. One NS pair bid and made the diamond slam; all other pairs had no problems in making thirteen tricks.
