The Laws of Duplicate Bridge have been updated and were published in late 2007 to become effective in 2008. The Australian Bridge Federation has decided that these laws will not become effective in Australia until 1 June 2008 in order that Tournament Directors may become familiar with the changes. The major law changes appear to be those affecting Insufficient Bids and Revokes. The club will ensure that our Tournament Directors will receive the necessary information and education before 1 June. However there is one change which players may as well get used to now – Law 7 C has been changed to read "After play has finished, each player should shuffle his/her original thirteen cards, after which he/she restores them to the pocket corresponding to his/her compass position".

So, don't forget to shuffle those cards - although recommended this is currently not compulsory!

GNOT 2008.

The ABF have issued updated regulations for this competition. One of the major changes will probably affect the composition of your team and is contained in Club Selection paragraph 2. In effect it means that the first time that you play in a team that is successful in earning a place in the Regional Final, that whole team must play in the Regional Final. All members of the team automatically become **non-contending players**, even if the team declines to play in the Regional Final. This means that, if any of these players play in a Club Selection event that finishes after the event in which they qualified, **any** member of the team in which they have played is **ineligible** to play in the Regional Final.

So, make sure that, when playing in your first qualifying event, you are playing in the team with which you wish to play in the Regional Final.

We have standbys for each session (not Monday night) but this is not meant to be a regular partnership.

Opportunity Missed.

My partner and I have on our system card 3NT – Kabel Ace Ask. In this convention an opening bid of 3NT asks about partner's holding in ACES. The four level responses show one ace in the suit bid so 4C – no aces, 4D – ace of diamonds; 4H – ace of hearts; 4S – ace of spades; 4NT – ace of clubs. The five level responses show two aces – the suit bid and a higher ranking ace so that 5C shows the club ace and a higher ranking ace etc.

Playing in the South West Pacific Teams in Canberra an opportunity arose to use this bid when I was dealt the following hand during the last match:

♠ AKQJT7 an ideal opportunity for the bidding to go

▼ 3 3NT (ace ask)

♦ AKQT72 4H (shows heart ace)

♣ - 7S

Looks good doesn't it! Unfortunately it did not happen as I did not recognise the opportunity! 6S making 7 was (luckily) a flat board. CM.
