#### BRIDGE FOR CHILDREN.... by Wendy Mitchell

Following suggestions by Paul Unger in relation to developing new bridge players, I recently approached the Principal of Gosford Public school re introducing bridge to students in the Opportunity Classes.

He was in favour, as the school tries to provide activities in the two 30-minute breaks student have each day. So far I have conducted three sessions in the school library for 30 minutes on a Monday morning, with 16, 15 and 11 students attending.

I am teaching a game called 'MiniBridge' which is almost identical to bridge as we know it, but without any bidding!! Essentially the cards are dealt, players count high card points and then announce their points. The partnership with the most wins the contract and declarer is the person with the most points in the partnership.

Dummy is now laid down and declarer decides on a contract – NT or suit, part score or game. The lead and play now proceed as normal and tricks/games scored as in the standard game. The big motivation is that the game is hands on from the beginning – students will learn card play and defence 'on the job'.

This game is played in schools in England, Europe and the USA. It is so effective that the English Bridge Union recommends it for adult beginners too. You may like to teach your grandchildren, or simply practise hands yourself using MiniBridge.

## **BRIDGE TRIVIA.....**

Bridge is the world's most popular card game and is played at a competitive level by over 20 million players world wide

The origins of bridge can be traced back to the whist card game first played in the 16th century.

The card game known as bridge was first played in the 1890's in London and New York.

The American multi millionaire Harold Vanderbilt decided that insufficient bonuses were given to players who contracted to make a high level of tricks playing Auction Bridge. Whilst on a cruise in 1925 he devised a new set of bonuses and method of bidding. This transformed the game from Auction to Contract Bridge. Some of the changes are still in use today
