An exciting new concept from the Australian Bridge Federation -

The ABF is holding Australia Wide Knockout Teams open to all affiliated clubs. Six sessions will be played on the <u>second Tuesday</u> of each month on <u>RealBridge</u>, commencing Tuesday, 13th June at 7.30pm. There are four categories in which our club can compete:

- 1) Open
- 2) Less than 750 masterpoints
- 3) Less than 100 masterpoints
- 4) Less than 50 masterpoints.

Each player must be a home club member, or have played at least 10 times at our Club in the past year. The club pays your entry fee, so no cost to you!

NSWBA Restructure Update Jake Andrew, Project Manager

In January 2023, John Scudder, the Chairman of the NSW Bridge Association (NSWBA), advised of the major recommendations of the NSWBA Strategic Review and shared the executive summary of that report.

To repeat, the major recommendations and priorities of the strategic review were for the NSW Bridge Association Limited, which currently owns Sydney Bridge Centre, to:

• create clear legal separation between the NSW state peak body (which manages bridge across NSW and supports all affiliated clubs) and the local Sydney club; and

• reassess the sustainability and strategic desirability of owning the 162 Goulburn premises, and sell if needed.

The aim of these recommendations is to **create long-term success** through clear purpose and objectives, and clearly aligned resources for both:

- a NSW state bridge body, working with and on behalf of all affiliated clubs across NSW; and
- a flourishing bridge club in the centre of Sydney.

Since the update sent in January, several changes have occurred:

1. Three working groups have been set-up to determine and allocate responsibilities, make recommendations for each group, and liaise with you where necessary:

• **Strategy Core Group (SCG)**, being four representatives of the NSWBA Council (former and current), to govern the overall strategic review project, determine the legal structure and change process, and assess timing options.

• **Sydney Bridge Centre Working Group (Club WG)**, comprising 10 members representing Sydney Bridge Centre. This group have met several times since February 2023, and have begun to plan for the changes to the constitution, premises options, budgeting, and resource requirements.

• New South Wales Working Group (State WG), representatives from several affiliate clubs across the state (including Sydney) met in late March to commence agreement on a governance structure and how they wish to work, define their purpose and objectives, and determine necessary committees and focus areas.

2. Creation of a **Transition Project Manager** role, a temporary part-time position to assist the NSWBA implement the agreed change in direction. This role has now been appointed, and I am really pleased to take on this role to help secure the long-term success for bridge across NSW and within the Sydney metro area.

3. A **draft timeline** has been developed with the aim of collaboratively agreeing a fair and amicable separation, plan for a smooth transition, and set-up both organisations for long-term success.

The NSWBA has already consulted widely in surveys, focus groups, and workshops, for your input on the need for change and the desired direction. All feedback has been captured, documented and considered. Please contact me at this email address (pm.transition@nswba.com.au), or face-to-face if you see me at an event, if you feel you have something important that remains unsaid, or have other key feedback.

Part of my role is to update you regularly on planned changes and timing. I expect to send you updates like this every few weeks to help keep us all aligned and informed.

TEAMS SCORING AND TACTICS

At the recent Teams of 3 players were given some strategies for Teams because the scoring differs from Pairs.

I have selected a few hands from the Barrier Reef Congress to illustrate some of these. Jan Clarke & Di Coats sat NS at our home table and Chris Williams & I sat EW at the opponent's table.

Match 2

<u>Board 17</u>, Nil Vul: The makeable game contracts were 3NT N, 4NT S, 4H N or S. Jan & Di bid and made 3NT for +400. At our table I was allowed to play in 2SX for -100. Nett +300 for +7 IMPs. Even down 2 double for -300 this would be a positive. However if I am kept to 5 tricks, doubled ,then -500 would result in a nett score of -100 and -3 IMPs.

<u>Board 21</u>, NS Vul: At our table we allowed 4H by N to make 11 (-650) when it can be kept to 9 tricks. At the other table 4SX by W was defeated by 2 tricks, +300. Nett score –350 and –8 IMPs.

<u>Board 26,</u> All Vul: This time bad defence by the opposition allowed me to make 3C (+110) when I should only make 7 tricks. Jan & Di defended well so that 3C made 7 for +200. Nett result +310 and +7 IMPs.

<u>Board 27</u>, Nil Vul: We bid correctly to 3NT which Chris, East, played well for +400. At the other table E did not find the right line of play and was down 1, +50 to us. Nett +450 and +10 IMPs.

Match 7

<u>Board 2</u>, NS Vul: 4S by Chris made the possible 10 tricks, +420. At the other table the opponents only bid to 3S, making 10, for -170. Nett +250 and +6 IMPs.

Board 9, EW Vul: 3D by me made the possible 11 tricks, +150. However at the other table EW bid the 5D game, -600. Nett -450 and -10 IMPs.

(BTW - we won both the matches above.)
