Feeling a bit guilty because I should have been out gardening on the sunny day, I played in this event conducted on Bridge Base Online (BBO). Advertised as a fun event, with a set system card for all to follow, only 24 people competed.

It looked a bit daunting when I saw that Emerald Grand Masters, Pauline Gumby & Warren Lazer, were playing but they only finished in the middle of the field!

We played 3xboard rounds over 2 sessions with 18 different partners, all but 5 of the field. I played against 18 different people, some of course more than once. 13 players were from 6 different Sydney clubs, the rest from across the State, except for one from Queensland. Nearly all rankings were represented, from Bronze Local upwards.

The event was won by Marelle Irvine, Gold Life Master from Mudgee. 2nd was Rick Lu, State Master, Sydney Bridge Club, equal 3rd Yours Truly, Grand Master and Bev Furner, National Master from Griffith.

BRIDGE EDUCATION

HONESTY IS THE (BEST) ONLY POLICY

Following last month's article on alerts I'm sure you are all alerting promptly now!? If enquiring about an alerted call you should ask "what do you understand by that bid?" If asking at the end of an auction the question should be "could I have an explanation of the auction please?"

<u>Experienced players</u>: when you have been asked about an alerted bid, remember that it is wrong simply to name a convention – you must explain exactly what the bid means in your system, ie the suit(s) shown and length, point range, suits denied etc. For the benefit of newer players please explain *clearly*, *simply and slowly*.

Novice players: It is forbidden to have secret partnership agreements, so you are entitled to be told the meaning of an alerted bid as well as all the bids at the end of the auction. However, remember that you can only *ask* when it is your turn to bid. You should be given full disclosure so that you can draw conclusions as to the shape and strength of the opponents'

hands. You do not need to *understand* the conventions being used and should not question further provided a clear explanation has been given. You have been taught two of the most common conventions, Stayman and Jacoby transfers over majors, but there are many variations of these and there are hundreds of other conventions! You will learn the Blackwood convention in the Improvers Course and more when you reach the Intermediate stage.

Meanwhile, concentrate on your own bidding and play. If you have asked about the bidding, listen carefully to the explanation as this will assist you in defence which is the hardest aspect of the game. Below are a few hints on coping with some of the conventions and other bidding systems you may meet.

1. WHAT IS A CONVENTION?

A *convention* is defined as a bid/call that gives or requests information <u>unrelated</u> to the denomination named or not showing length in that suit. eg:

- 1C opening that may contain less than 3xclubs
- 2C (Stayman) in response to partner's 1NT opening

2. HOW CAN I COMPETE WITH CONVENTIONS?

Usually you need to find out what a conventional bid means in order to:

- Make an overcall or not!
- Choose the best suit/card to lead
- Find the best defensive play

There is one situation in which you can be proactive:

If you DOUBLE a *conventional* bid you are telling partner that denomination is <u>your</u> suit. If on lead, partner MUST lead it to you.

- * 2C (Stayman) is a convention that does not show a club suit
- ** You hold perhaps AKJ109 and you need a club lead from partner!

3. OTHER BIDDING SYSTEMS

You have learned a basic form of 'Standard American' in which your 1H/1S openings promise 5+ cards and your 1NT opening is 'strong'.

Most people in our club also play Standard American, but they may play variations that you do not use. You may meet:

▶ 2 over 1, Game Force.

eg 1S – 2C: the 2C bidder has 13+ points (not just 10+), guaranteeing game.

eg 1S – 1NT: the 1NT bidder has 6 - 12 HCP and opener must bid once more.

▶ **Precision** An opening of 1C is a *convention* that promises 16+ HCP and says nothing about clubs. The response is 1D (another *convention*) with 0 – 6/7 HCP. Any other response is stronger and natural. Note that, even if responder has only 4HCP, they have at least 20 HCP between them, so BEWARE.

The Precision 1D opening does not necessarily contain diamonds and the 2C opening is not strong but shows 5+ clubs and 11-15 HCP.

To compete: There are many complex gadgets that you can learn, but keep it simple for now.

- Only overcall their strong 1C with great suit and a good opening hand. If you are VUL and they are NV, it is usually best to keep quiet.
- Over their 1D, overcalls are fine, but if you hold diamonds, then PASS
- Over their 1H/S, normal overcall rules apply
- ► Transfer Responses to 1C ie 1C 1D shows 4xHearts, 1C 1H shows 4xSpades, 1C 1S shows 4xDiamonds.

To compete: A simple method in third seat is to double the artificial response to show that suit. Eg 1D response to 1C is artificial, so **double** shows a D suit.
