

TUESDAY REALBRIDGE – Eclectic

A total of 18 different pairs competed over the 5 sessions in April. 11 of these played at least twice but two of these pairs contained the same player playing with different partners. As a result only 10 are eligible and half of these receive extra masterpoints from outright awards.

Because of the duplication of a player, the results posted to the website are incorrect. Adjustments will be made but the total of 0.65 masterpoints will remain the same. This will be done with the May masterpoint files.

ZELDA OVERHALL CUP HISTORY

Mrs Zelda Overhall (now deceased) was appointed Patron of Central Coast Leagues Club Bridge Club when it was formed in August 1987. This was in recognition of Zelda's outstanding work in the promotion of bridge on the Central Coast. She had been instrumental in forming the Central Coast Bridge Club but was perhaps best known as a bridge teacher.

A trophy, called the Patron's Cup, was introduced in 1991, but the event is now named after Zelda specifically. Because of her huge influence as a teacher on Central Coast bridge players, the event is for lower-ranked players.

The trophy is won by the best Bronze Regional (or below) pair

There is also a Special Prize for the best Silver Local (or below) pair. (Players of higher rankings can play on the day and earn points, but not the trophy.)

If your ranking qualifies you to compete, then you need to play with another eligible player. Perhaps this won't be your regular partner, but you can find one by referring to the list displayed on the pillar near the Director's table.

Players must be financial members of CCLCBC. Last year we had 5.5 tables from 69 eligible players. This year there are 88 players of eligible ranking so we hope for a good roll up!

Bridge NSW

Consultation on proposed Governance Arrangements, Constitution and By-Laws of Bridge NSW now Finalised

Thank you to all Clubs and individuals who participated in the consultation process on the draft Constitution and By-Laws for Bridge NSW.

- There was very strong support for the proposals for voting rights and representation on Council and those have been adopted without alteration.
- The proposal to require clubs to separate affiliation and capitation fees from the remainder of member fees was opposed by the majority of clubs and has not been adopted (clause 13(3)). Nonetheless we encourage clubs to ensure transparency by informing members of the fees paid by the club to the ABF and Bridge NSW on their behalf.
- A number of other detailed changes were made in response to the consultation.

Next steps

The next phase in the separation process is the approval by the ABF of Bridge NSW Limited as the constituent association of the ABF for New South Wales. This approval is expected to take place at the ABF AGM on 24 May. We expect that separation will occur soon thereafter, pending the completion of several administrative processes.

The creation of a separate peak body is an exciting opportunity for the bridge community in NSW and we thank you for your continued support.
