From the Bottom Table

In an article appearing in the August Newsletter, Your Correspondent (YC) suggested, in passing, that DDA technology be used to solve a bridge playing problem.

It has come to my attention that many may not know what DDA technology is, let alone how to use it. So, the question arises:

Just what is "DDA Technology"?


DDA is an abbreviation for *Double Dummy Analysis*. It goes under many names, one of which is *Bridge Solver*. Much information on the use of DDA / Bridge Solver is freely available on the internet, so this explanation will address one particular problem: How do I use this technology to show me how to make that extra trick and earn maximum Match Points instead of a bottom board?

On one recent Thursday night, NS pairs were presented with this board:

Most NS pairs settled for a 3NT contract, mainly by South, with one brave pair exploring slam and ending up in 5NT.

One NS pair made the maximum 12 tricks, earning a top board, while other NS pairs made 9, 10 or 11 tricks.

To use DDA on this board, go to the Club's web site, look at



the results, and click on your (or any) name, and a list of all boards played will appear. Click on Board 9.

You should see a list of all pairs who played the board, tricks made, scores, as well as the hand record which appears above.

On your computer screen (NOT on this Newsletter link), click on the "Replay and analyze" link. You should see the image which appears on the top of the next page.



To start your analysis, in the bottom right hand corner of your screen, click on 6NT by North.

You should see the image to the right.

This image tells you that, provided NS plays the cards correctly, it doesn't matter what card East leads, it is possible for North to make 12 tricks.

Click on a few other contracts. Look at the difference the first lead makes!

Play each card in turn as it would



be played at your table, and see if you can make the maximum of 12 tricks in a NT contract.

This has been just a quick introduction on the basic use of DDA / Bridge Solver. It is up to you, the reader, to decide how to use this technology when reviewing your day's performance at the bridge table. KH

BRIDGE EDUCATION

1. **DONT**

Yes, these are the initials of a well-known bridge convention used to compete over a 1NT opening of the opponents. It stands for *Disturb Opponents No Trump*.

However it could also stand for DO Not Teach (beginners/improvers!)

Like mathematics, bridge learning is incremental, each step depending on good understanding of the step before. We ask you to trust the qualified bridge teachers to know their pupils and the structure of the courses we offer.

You may well be a better player who wants to share their knowledge. However, we ask you to restrain your good intentions. Many of our newer players are being confused by new ideas and conventions because they have not yet mastered those they have been taught.

My ABF

About 60% of our members are already registered with MyABF because they have played in our Congress or congresses and events elsewhere. This allows a player to pay for their entry fee using a credit card.

There are many other functions either already available or in development for use in the near future:

1. <u>Payment of table fees for regular duplicate sessions</u> - by setting up bridge credits in advance. The club then receives a monthly amount from MyABF for the sessions held.

and

<u>Uploading of session results</u> to MyABF

Some clubs are already using this function and, having considered the other options available, our directors and committee members are keen to use it.

Procedures for players, directors and the Treasurer will change.

- 2. <u>Payment of annual club membership fees</u> and general Membership management using MyABF. This function is planned to be ready before the end of the year.
 - Again, procedures will change for players and the Memberships Secretary, but there will be many advantages for both.
- 3. <u>Group emails</u> to members or sub-groups of members. This function will simplify the work of our club Secretary and others who need to communicate with our players.
- 4. <u>Masterpoint Processing</u> The Masterpoint Centre that is currently used has very old software that is being phased out. It's functions will be taken over by MyABF. Procedures will be different for the Masterpoint Secretary but the workload very much reduced.
- 5. <u>Club Calendar</u> There will be the possibility of all our events being displayed via MyABF

What does all this mean for you, the player?

Firstly, the remaining 40% of our membership will need to register with MyABF. We ask you to do this AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.


How do you do this? You will need your ABF number and a valid email address.

Go to myabf.com.au and click on the SIGN UP button at the top right.
This window will appear.

In the spaces indicated enter your

- ABF number
- Email Address
- A password (at least 8 characters) that you will use when you log in to your account.

Repeat the password on the Confirm Password line



Then click the blue SIGN UP bar, and your account is established.

You will receive an email telling you to click a blue ACTIVATE button to activate your account. (If you don't get this email check your spam folder).

Once you have activated your account the system will automatically log you in and take you to the Dashboard (shown below) so that you can set up the account.

You will now be able to see the *Dashboard* which gives you access to Support, Announcements & Forums and to your (and others') Masterpoints.

That is all you need to do for now! If you need assistance, any of the ad hoc Committee members or other players will happily help.

If you have not registered in the next couple of weeks, you will be contacted to guide you through the process.

What comes next?

Set up Payment Details
 Click on the green symbol.



Here you can set up your method of paying for Bridge Credits.

When Membership Renewals become due, you will be asked to deposit money to this ABF account, say \$100. Then your membership fee, whether it is Home or Associate will be paid from your account to our Club

When our club is ready to run regular sessions via MyABF, you will need credit in your account so that your table fee will automatically be paid. No more cash for the Standby to collect!

There is an 8-page document which will answer any questions and allay any fears you may have about Bridge Credits - just Google *What are bridge credits and how do they work?*
