#### **NOVEMBER 2024 CONGRESS AND TOURNAMENT REPORT**

It was a busy month for events, and many of our members travelled to compete.

**Southern Highland Congress (2-3 Nov):** Kevin Hughes with Lucy D'Ambrosio claimed first place in the Restricted Swiss pairs, winning every match. Congratulations! Peter and Elaine Hume also played and finished in the top half of the 18 pairs.

**Parramatta Foundation Day Teams (3 Nov):** Twenty-four teams competed in this event. Helen Milward teamed up with Paul Weaver, Jane Beeby and Helen Lowry and finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> place; Wendy Mitchell, Margaret Regan, Steph Mathews and Gary Heyting finished 9<sup>th</sup>. Both teams had four wins and two losses.

**BNSW State Matchpoint Swiss Pairs (4 Nov):** Ten pairs competed in this event including Di Coats and Alan Bustany, who finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Well done!

**Mudgee Bridge Club Congress (9-10 Nov):** Forty-two pairs competed in the Section A Swiss Pairs. Di Coats and Jan Clarke finished 7<sup>th</sup>; Anne Grayden and Julie Sadler finished 32<sup>nd</sup>. Di and Jan teamed up with Julie and Anne for the Section A Teams event and finished 6<sup>th</sup> out of 18. Well done ladies!

**IBA State Novice and Restricted Teams (9-10 Nov):** Eighteen teams competed in this event. Kevin Hughes and Lucy D'Ambrosio teamed up with Jane Stephens and Colin Kleinig and finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> place after 17 matches with 11 win and 6 losses. Congratulations!

**State Open Pairs Championship (16-17 Nov):** Most of the pairs playing in this event qualified at club-level events at country and metro clubs around the state earlier in the year. Thirty-five pairs competed in the qualifying round on Saturday, with the top seven east/west and top seven north/south pairs moving on to the final event on Sunday.

In the **qualifying round** Anne Grayden with Julie Sadler (5<sup>th</sup> place N/S) and Di Coats with Jan Clark (5<sup>th</sup> place E/W) qualified to play in the final on Sunday.

A hearty congratulations to you all for doing so well in a very competitive field!

Several other CCLCBC members played in the qualifying event: Dasha Brandt and David Bowerman (10<sup>th</sup> N/S); Eunice De Vries and Wendy Mitchell (14<sup>th</sup> N/S); and Steph Mathews and Gary Heyting (11<sup>th</sup> E/W). In the **finals** Di and Jan finished 10<sup>th</sup>, and Julie and Anne finished 13<sup>th</sup>. While this event historically included a country pairs final, only six country pairs played, precluding a separate final. Jan & Di were declared the Country Pairs Champions.

BNSW Spring Pairs Congress (17 Nov): Those of us who did not qualify for the State Open Pairs final were granted entry to the BNSW Spring Pairs Congress on Sunday. Dasha Brandt and David Bowerman finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> place out of 20 pairs - well done! Steph and Gary scraped into the top half, finishing 10<sup>th</sup>; and Wendy and Eunice finished 13<sup>th</sup>.

**BNSW State Swiss Pairs (18 Nov):** Twenty-four pairs played in this event including Di Coats and Alan Bustany, who finished 15<sup>th</sup>

BNSW State Open Teams Finals (29 Nov): Ten teams from around the state competed online in this event. Di Coats, Jan Clarke, Sharon Mayo and Sally Clarke, representing The

Hunter and Central Coast, finished first in the qualifying round with and impressive seven wins and two losses. The top four teams played off in the final with our Hunter/Central Coast team falling to the BNSW team of Peter Buchen, Bruce Neil, Warren Lazer, and Pauline Gumby - the latter are the State Open Teams champions and the Di, Jan, Sharon & Sally are the Country Teams champions.

**NSW Online Pairs League Spring 2024:** This red point event was held on Real Bridge over eight weeks with 12-board matches. The field was divided into four divisions based on MPs and past performance.

Di Coats and Jan Clarke finished 5<sup>th</sup> E/W in Division 1; Gwen White and Margo Brennan finished 7<sup>th</sup>. Steph Mathews and Gary Heyting finished 2<sup>nd</sup> E/W in Division 2 with Anne Grayden and Julie Sadler 4<sup>th</sup>. In Division 3, Peter Mackey and Ruth Griffin finished 6<sup>th</sup> N/S, and Agnes Marsh and Barbara Grant finished 7<sup>th</sup> E/W.



Congratulations to Stuart Gibson and Ernest Shapero for reaching 6S on the following hand on <u>Thursday November 14</u>.



It is exactly 12 months since Stuart graduated from Eunice's Beginners course and just 6 months for Ernest.

Without interference, David Bowerman and Eunice bid to 6NT.

Here is a possible sequence:

2D (Multi)

2H (relay)

4D (17+, 4441, 1xD)

4NT (Simple Blackwood)

5S (3 Aces) 6NT

At my table: 2H P (H's + another)

5H P

(should not bid again)

4H 5D (Good hand)
P 6D (Extra strong)

# Monday Eve, Nov 25

At my table:

P P 1D P

1S P 3S P Two other pairs bid the ambitious game,

4S P P P but failed to make.


Lead: HK

Counting Losers: 0xS, 1 or 2xH,

1xD, 1xC

Recognising the *Bath Coup* situation, I did not take the HA on the first trick.

If this had been a NT contract, South should discourage with the H9, telling partner there is no helpful honour in H's. However, in a suit contract, it is right to encourage with the H7, hoping to gain a ruff.



North continued with the HQ, won with the HA and establishing the HJ. Trumps were drawn, finishing in hand. Then the D8 was led towards dummy.

South took the DA and cashed the CA and had to play a D or a C. Win in dummy, run Ds, ruff a D, ruff a C, pitch the last C on the established D.

If North switches after the HK, say to a trump, draw another round of spades and lead the D. South wins with the DA and plays a H. Now rise with HA, enter dummy with a high S, discard the remaining H on a D, establish D's as before to discard C's. Lose 1xC at the end.

If you win the first heart trick, the contract will fail because South will win DA, cash CA and has a H to play back to North's H10 and HQ.

# RELEASE OF MYABF, V.6.0

As promised, this version includes the new Membership Module.

CCLCBC had already decided to use this functionality to issue annual renewals and collect membership fees using 'Bridge Credits'.


If you are already a user of MYABF, you will now see a list of Club Memberships in your Profile after you log in.


This is my own record – for my Home Club, CCCBC I have allowed 'Share profile data' and ticked 'Auto pay fees'. I am also currently a member of BWBC but have not allowed these options, as yet.


You will receive an email about renewals after CCLCBC sets up various administration parameters. DO NOTHING UNTIL THEN!

The following explains the various options through a number of flowcharts – choose the one that applies to you.

- 1. Registered with MYABF, with dollars in Bridge Credits (Page 9)
- 2. Registered with MYABF with \$0 in Credits (Page 10)
- 3. Not Registered with MYABF (Page 11)







#### GLOSSARY and INFORMATION for MYABF

**Bridge Credits** are simply Australian dollars in an online account. (1 credit = 1A\$).

*Note:* Bridge Credits are NOT SPECIFIC TO OUR CLUB. They are an account with the ABF. They can be used for ANY <u>event</u> or <u>club session</u> run through My ABF and for payment of <u>club annual fees</u>.

# **Using Bridge Credits**

Every player and every club in My ABF has an account with the ABF. Whether they choose to use it is entirely up to them.

- 1. <u>Simple account</u> Pay for events individually online by card All common credit cards are supported except AMEX.
- 2. <u>Prepayment account</u> This will save the need to input your card details every time you want to enter and pay for an event.
- **a) Manual Top-Up**: A card payment made <u>manually</u> to top-up the balance on your account.

Use the Top Up Balance button: Enter the amount you want (between \$50 and \$2,000) and click Top Up.

\$ TOP UP BALANCE

Enter your card details in the white box in the middle and click Pay: Your statement will now include a line item showing the manual top up adding to your balance.

**b) Auto Top-Up**: A pre-established card payment triggered automatically to top up your account when your balance falls below 20 credits.

"Auto top-up" makes your account operate a bit like a public transport card (e.g. Opal). This is very convenient as you can basically set it and never have to worry about it!

Auto Top Up (\$100) ON CHANGE CARD OR TOP UP AMOUNT

In the header click on the slider switch where it says "Off":to turn Auto top-up on.

Select the amount you want to top up your card by each time (\$50, \$100, \$150 or \$200).

Complete Card Details and click "Save Card"

#### **SECURITY**

The card details you put in here are not stored by the ABF. They are securely stored via Stripe, the online payment provider. The ABF never sees or stores any card details for any player at any time.

**Registered MYABF user:** You have provided your email address to MYABF and created a password. This sets up your Account and allows you to see your Results, Upcoming Events etc. You control what information is in your Profile.

**Unregistered MYABF user:** You have not yet registered - your club may send you an invitation to do so or you can follow these steps:


• From our club Home Page, choose *Links* and then *Australian Bridge Federation*. At the far top right click on MYABF and follow the steps.

#### OR

 From our club Home Page, choose *Links* and MYABF Dashboard. Follow the steps.

You will receive an email telling you to click a blue ACTIVATE button to activate your account.

Once you have activated your account the system will automatically log you in and take you to the Dashboard so that you can set up the account.



# **Auto Pay**

This is a facility for a registered user to have their annual membership payment deducted from their Bridge Credits account, automatically on a set date. *For CCLCBC this will be December 27, 2024*.

#### Pay Now

This allows a registered user to pay at a time of their own choosing (ie manual, not automatic)

# Do I have to buy Bridge Credits in advance?

For congresses - NO.

**For CCLCBC club sessions in 2025** – YES PLEASE\*. This is because club session payments are usually smaller amounts and it's not economic in terms of transaction fees to have lots of small payments go through separately. So there is a minimum \$50 top-up requirement which then gets used up as you play sessions or enter other events.

Your table fees are simply taken off your account balance each time you play. Each transaction is itemised in both your account and the club's account.

\**Note*:

It will still be possible to pay by cash, if necessary, or to make use Free Game Cards.
