PAULINE EVANS NOVICE PAIRS

Thursday Evening March 13

This is a trophy event for players with less than 100 masterpoints (at January 1) held in memory of Pauline Evans

Who was Pauline Evans? A mother of 5, she played bridge at the highest level, representing both Queensland and NSW many times. She also represented Australia as both a member and Captain of the National Women's team.

Not long after being diagnosed with a terminal disease, Pauline and her husband Jim moved to the Central Coast and she joined CCLCBC. Sadly she died the next year. Jim then donated funds for a perpetual trophy in her name.

Because she was always so supportive of new players it was decided to create a red point event for novice players. She always showed good humour, friendliness and helpfulness at the bridge table

Half of our club is eligible for this trophy. Though few of you will have known Pauline, here is an opportunity to at least earn some red masterpoints! You don't have to be a regular Thursday player to participate – just have less than 100 MPs, turn up and make this a great night.



This is awarded for the most improved player over calendar year with the following conditions: Financial member, played at least 30 sessions, less than 100 MPs at January 1.

Improvement is measured using the ABF Master-pointFormula:

Points This Year * 10000)/(Total Points + 100)

Dorothy Berzins presented this trophy to Kevin Hughes who won it in 2023 and was the clear winner again for 2024.

His improvement has been meteoric, moving from Silver Local to Regional, Bronze Regional, State and then Bronze State in 12 months. This last ranking requires a minimum of 50 Gold/Red masterpoints – Kevin achieved this during November last year.

2. The role of the Director

Law 81 describes the Official Status, Restrictions and Responsibilities, Duties and Powers of the Director.

Some extracts – 'The Director is the official representative of the Tournament Organiser' and 'The Director is responsible for the on-site technical management of the tournament' and 'to maintain discipline and to ensure the orderly progress of the game'

THE DIRECTOR IS IN CHARGE OF THE ROOM

Most players acknowledge that the director has a difficult job. At CCLCBC we pay our directors to carry out their tasks and in recognition of the time they devote.

Remember:

• If you have any specific seating needs you must contact the Director *in advance* of the session.

These will be accommodated IF POSSIBLE.

• Results of a session are available at the end of play and uploaded to our website. However these are only provisional for 48 hours as this is the time frame for notifying the director of scoring errors.

BIDDING 7NT

Sometimes you can go for months/years without finding this absolute top scoring bridge contract. In the past few weeks there have been several opportunities. The most recent:

- 1. Interclub Teams, Thursday February 27 Match 1, Board 7 After South passed, my partner (West) opened 1C (3+ suit). With the following hand I am immediately thinking of a possible Slam:
- ♠ KQ8 With great restraint I respond 1H and partner rebids 3C!
- ♥ AKO9
- QT4 The jump bid promises 6xsuit and better than a MINI hand,
- ♣ K52 usually 16+ HCPs.

So, 4NT (Roman Keycard Blackwood) receives the response of 5D – 0 or 3 Keycards.

Assuming 3 because of the jump, it is a good idea to ask for the CQ by bidding 5H.


The reply (in our system) is 5NT – yes, with no additional Kings.

On the face of it this is disappointing, but in fact it doesn't matter because I can count 14 of a possible 13 tricks!

Clubs -6, Diamonds -1, Hearts -4 and Spades -3. So 7NT is bid. The lead is the S10 and I make all the tricks. Here is partner's hand:

- ♠ AJ This might have been a match-winning result,
- ♥ 62 but in fact was a match-saver.
- ♦ A76
- ◆ AQT987 Our other boards were not so good and our overall result was a draw The statistics for this board were:
 - 3NT (12) 1
 - 3NT (13) 3
 - 6C (13) 4
 - 6NT (13) 4
 - 7NT (13) 1

2. Here is an extreme example from January 29. Our EW opponents were one of four pairs who bid a good 6H, making 13 tricks. 8 other pairs were in 3NT or 4/5H all making.



North passes and East opens 1NT* with the balanced 17 HCPs. West bids 2D as a transfer to 2H and after East complies, bidding controls may find you the grand slam in Hearts or NT.

It is not recommended for a hand with a void to use Blackwood to ask for Aces. Suppose:

East	West
1NT	2D
2H	4NT

Playing simple Blackwood, East shows the 2 missing Aces. 5NT asks for Kings and East shows 2. Unfortunately, unless you play a specific King ask, West does not know which 2!

Now try this using Roman Keycard Blackwood: East shows 3 controls – the two missing Aces AND the King of trumps. When West asks for Kings, East shows 2 (in addition to the HK.) Next, count the tricks of which West can be certain:

Spades – 2 (A and K in East's hand)

Hearts -8 (there is a known 10xcard fit so the HQ can be expected to drop)

Diamonds – 1 (A in East's hand)

Clubs -2 (A with West and K with East)

Total tricks – 13. Best scoring contract? 7NT

* If you decide this hand is worth 18 then you may open 1S.
