

LAST MONTH'S PROBLEM



How can South make all 13 tricks in Diamonds, given the D10 lead?

Only one answer was received, from Ros Dey. Congratulations! (Now 13 tricks looks easy!)

In her words . . .

I can see 11 tricks (3xS, 1xH, 5xD and 2xC) and need to find two more.

If West has at least 3 clubs, we can play 2 top clubs then ruff one low then return to hand and ruff another with DQ. Importantly, we need to preserve communication, and not incur an unnecessary ruff.

Take the diamond lead in dummy, and play CA, CK (discarding a heart) and club ruff. If East ruffs 3rd round, then over ruff.

A diamond back to dummy reveals 3/1 split. Play the last club and ruff with DQ. You can now play a small spade to SK, draw the last trump and discard a heart on the third spade.

DOUBLING FOR TAKEOUT

The standard 'takeout' double applies after an opponent opens with a suit bid. For example -

1H, then X (by you) asks partner to bid, ie 'take out' the contract from 1H to something else.

However, when your Partner has opened and the next hand makes an overcall of a suit, then X by you is also for takeout, eg:

1xsuit (partner) - suit overcall - X (you) asks partner to bid again.

This double by responder has the unusual name of a *negative double*.

On Monday Evening there was some lively discussion at the bridge table, with some varying opinions about negative doubles in particular situations

Top teachers and writers (Ron Klinger, Larry Cohen, Barbara Seagram etc) agree on the following general principles.

- 1. The doubler promises the other Major or Majors
- 2. At the 1-level only 6+ points are required; more points are needed at higher levels.

In summary:

Opener	Over- caller	Res- ponder	Comment
1 x minor	minor	X	BOTH Majors, 4+ / 4+
1 x minor	Major	X	OTHER Major, 4+
1 x Major	minor	X	OTHER Major, 4+, < 3x support for partner
1 x Major	Major	X	Both minors, 4+ / 4+

If responder bids a suit at the 2-level (instead of doubling), this guarantees a 5xsuit and 10+ points.

There are 2 special cases at the 1-level.

Case 1

Opener	Over- caller	Res- ponder	Comment
1C	1D	1H	4 + suit, 6+ points, denies the
IC.	ID -	1S	other major

Case 2

Opener	Over- caller	Res- ponder	Comment
1C	1H	X	Exactly 4 x spades, 6+ points


On Page 7 is an example of Case 1 from Friday May 2:

East opens 1C. If South passes, West bids 1H, East raises to 2H (mini 12-15), and now with 13 Total Points, West can bid the 4H game. Five pairs out of 8 did this, making 10 tricks.

However, what if South overcalls 1D?

If West had 4/4 in both Majors, a *negative double* would apply. However, with only 1xMajor, the correct bid is 1H.

Note that this promises 4+ hearts and 6+ points. Bidding can then proceed as before.



Many players find it hard to bid 1H over 1D, as we expect that an overcall of an overcall promises a 5x suit. The above situation is the exception to this rule!

If West doubles with the above hand, East is assured that this shows BOTH Majors. If East happens to have 4xspades and a stronger hand they would bid 3S or even 4S. Then West may not have the bidding space to correct to No Trumps.

If West bids 2NT immediately, showing a D stopper and 10-12 HCPs, the 4-4 heart fit will be missed.

Barbara Seagram believes that the Negative Double is the third most important convention after Blackwood and Stayman! Two situations where you should not use a negative double:

- 1. Always show support if partner opens a Major
- 2. With 10+ HCPS, shift to a 5+ suit if you can

There is plenty more to learn about how opener and responder continue the bidding and what to do if there is interference.

Standard negative doubles are played at the 1 and 2-levels, but can be played at higher levels, by partnership agreement.

Try your understanding of the basics with the following questions.

Choose the correct bid, and give a brief explanation for your choice. **A FREE GAME** will be given to every player, ranked **LOCAL MASTER OR BELOW**, who answers correctly.
