Therese & Guy Chan - despite having badly damaged hands in a car accident Guy was witnessed managing a lobster using chop sticks without getting his hands dirty! Also known as the "good looking Chinaman" - if you ask me I will tell you why;

Graham Winder - Principal of Terrigal High school - playing with our first patron *Zelda Overhall*;

Geza Sarkozy who had to learn at least two new languages - Spanish when he ended up in South America after the Hungarian uprising and then Australian.;

Alys Alexander - expert dart player who used to put her opening lead on the table and then rub it around before turning it over to put the magic into it!

FROM THE ABF BRIDGE COLUMN

(http://www.abf.com.au/abf-daily-column/):

With the current coronavirus situation, many/most/nearly all bridge clubs have closed or will be closed soon. It is not easy to keep 1.5 metres distance when playing bridge. So, what to do to keep the little grey bridge cells functioning. Here are some ideas:

- Go to <u>www.abfevents.com.au/abfdbc/</u> daily for a free bridge column courtesy of Ron Klinger.
- Read / reread some of your bridge books to maintain or even improve your standard.
- Buy a new bridge book for the same purpose.
- If not already a subscriber, take out an annual bridge subscription to <u>Australian</u> Bridge and to overseas bridge magazines.
- Join Bridge Base Online (<u>bridgebase.com</u>) it is free or log in if already a member. There are heaps of activities possible on BBO: □ Watch top players in action.
 □ Join a table and play with three other players from anywhere in the world. □ You and your partner can join a table and play against two others. □ You can arrange with three

friends to play at the same table. \Box You can organize 7 other players to play a teams' match. \Box You can play by yourself against three robots or you can play with your regular partner against two robots (Cost \$US1 pw). \Box You can have just a bidding practice session with your partner. \Box Tackle Bridge Master (4 sets of 30 declarer play problems at different levels).

- Read the ABF Newsletter
- Read the bridge columns which still appear in some newspapers.
- There are some outlets for bridge classes via the internet.
- You can help a friend to learn bridge, or play more yourself via various options on www.acbl.org/learn_page/

Paul Marston is offering a free a weekly bridge column to hopefully keep players amused whilst clubs are closed. Paul is happy to send this to anyone who signs on here: https://bridgelounge.online/free-subscription/

Joan Butts the ABF National Teaching Co-ordinator, has offered a one month's free access to her Online School of Bridge.

Ron Klinger, an Australian icon of the bridge world, has offered to provide a daily bridge column for free whilst the pandemic is on. This is an extraordinarily generous offer by Ron and the ABF will host the column on the ABF web site which will have a link on the front page for you to read it. http://www.abfevents.com.au/abfdbc/ Barbara Travis, one of Australia's leading players for many years and a bridge journalist, has also contributed a guide on how to set up 'pre-set' matches on BBO where you can compare yourself with the world's best. She has also started a paid weekly bridge column which can be found at http://www.bridgewithbarbara.com which is excellent for club players as well as experts.

Stepbridge.com.au is an Australian NFP online bridge site that is affiliated with the South Australian Bridge Federation. It usually has one competition session a day at 8.00pm AEST or 4.00pm on Weekends with ABF Masterpoints just like any other bridge club in Australia. The current playing fees are basically \$3 a tournament game and once a month they hold a red masterpoint game. You can also play social bridge with no fees. Now they have added a second session each day at 1.00pm AEST.

<u>Bridgebase.com</u> or <u>BBO</u> is the biggest online bridge site in the world where you can play bridge, practice with partners or robots, test your play, challenge your friends and watch (kibitz) the best players in the world playing in tournaments. One can organise a game with friends or play anonymously for free with strangers or robots which you may find to be more friendly.

<u>Funbridge.com</u> has 400,000 members from 190 countries who play more than 800,000 deals a day. You can play at Funbridge.com even on your phone 24/7 at your own pace

and pause a deal and resume it later. I am trying to organise a Funbridge Australia club that may be more suitable for many club players.

English Bridge Union (EBU) has regular daily games on Funbridge and BBO and Bridge Club Live has over 500 people playing a day now.

Online dating for bridge players – Several people have suggested an App that would match up people wanting to play in homes. So if you are an App builder and could come up with a simple but effective way of matching people in local communities please get in contact with me.
