It has been a pleasure to greet our friends at the table, even if you can't see the smiles behind the masks. Hopefully more of you will join us in the coming weeks as we can accommodate many more tables.

MEMBERSHIP FEES AND BIDDING BOXES

38% of members are financial to date for 2021 (45 Home, 28 Associate). Understandably this is lower than last year at the same time (74% = 85 + 53) but there is the Covid-caution effect and the notice to renew was sent out later than usual.

So far 28 members have purchased their own bidding boxes. It is not essential to do so, but it does give you the confidence of knowing that only you have touched it.

In the present circumstances and venue it is easiest for all concerned if you can make payments by direct deposit for bidding boxes (\$12.50) and fees (\$33.10 or \$7) to:

ON-LINE BRIDGE

Many of you will continue to play on-line. In this case you may be interested to know that recently the ABF Management Committee announced the appointment of Chris Hughes as National Online Recorder.

The process which will be followed to address complaints regarding player behaviour and/or ethics in online bridge events conducted by the ABF can be found at <u>National Online Recorder Process</u>

The first section of this document is provided on Page 4.

NATIONAL ONLINE RECORDER - PUBLISHED PROCESS

The role of the Online National Recorder should initially reflect those duties of a recorder at a club or congress where face-to-face bridge is played. The Online National Recorder is available to hear a complaint by an individual and assess whether further action should be taken. Unlike in a face-to-face situation, where a Recorder may well advise the complainant to start an appeal process on a recently played board, the Online National Recorder will receive the complaint at some time after the session has been completed.

Guidelines for ABF Online Bridge Events

1. If there is an irregularity at the table in an online bridge session, the director should be called by pressing the blue button (with three white horizontal lines) in the top left-hand corner of the playing screen and selecting 'Call Director'. Where possible, most irregularities will be resolved at this juncture.

2. There may be instances where a player may not wish to 'inflame' the situation by accusing another player at the table of potentially questionable behaviour. Therefore, after the session has been completed, the player may wish an ABF specifically-appointed person to assess their complaint.

3. Any player wishing to complain about another player's and/or pairs' alleged misbehaviour or suspicious activity should send an email to <u>onlinerecorder@abf.com.au</u> (there are also other options including the Director of the event or 'BBO Abuse' [<u>abuse@bridgebase.com</u>]). It is strongly advised that the player making the complaint not post details on any social media platform or speak to anyone else (except perhaps their partner) about their course of action. Another source of input to the ABF National Online Recorder would be copies of complaints received by BBO that relate to ABF sanctioned online bridge events.

4. All emails sent to <u>onlinerecorder@abf.com.au</u> must contain the details of the event played, including the date and hand number (for specific situations rather than general complaints), plus a detailed account of the alleged incident and the 'BBO' login name(s) of the accused.

5. The complainant will be contacted by the ABF's National Online Recorder by email to acknowledge receipt of the complaint. A HAND FOR THE NEW DECADE Sitting West on Monday night I picked up this amazing 7-6 hand.

1D by me, double by North, 1S from Eunice (East), Pass or 2H (?) by South and 5C by me. North now bid 5H and partner doubled.

What to do? I felt 'robbed' and having no defence to 5HX I decided to bid 6C, expecting to go down as I have no Aces.

Partner gave preference by passing and the $\mathbf{\Psi}A$ was led.

I ruffed this ♣3, crossed to dummy's ♦A and ran the ♣8. Magically this forces the CA! Win

any return, draw trumps and claim, for 1370. Note there is nothing to discard on the \mathbf{V} K! At the other table, 5HX went for 1100. Even a sacrifice in 6HX works if NS manages the possible 7 tricks.


