FROM COLIN'S HOSPITAL BED

The ABF masterpoint scheme allows for tournaments to be played between 2 or more clubs (which can be from different regions). Our first Interclub Teams event was held in February 2000 with approval given for the (then) three registered clubs in our region to participate. Now of course there are four clubs eligible to compete in these Red point events. They are classified B5i with 80% weighting of our regular B4c Red point events.

In fact CCLCBC had programmed various teams events since 1993, but these were Open events, not restricted to local club members. I recall having to send home to Sydney a none-too-happy team who thought they could participate under the new arrangement.

Our club hosts two of these events a year. The last InterClub event was held just before lockdown in 2020, so it is great to be back! Understandably numbers are down this year, but in recent times they have ranged from a low of 9 teams in September 2013 to a high of 22 in February 2019.

Most experienced players rate teams competition highly and many regard it as the best form of the game as the scoring system rewards good contracts and play, not the riskiest.

So it is not surprising that there was an even earlier competition in which CCLCBC took part – the *Northern Region Inter-Club Teams*. The B Grade was won by a Newcastle team in 1989, by the Central Coast BC in 1990 and in 1991 by the CC Leagues Club. This was the last year appar-

ently, as we hold the trophy.

I have proposed that this handsome plate be resurrected as an Inter-Club trophy. As Patron I would have liked to be here today to present it to the winners - instead I wish you good cards and good luck; an enjoyable day and congratulations in advance.



WHAT ARE THE ODDS?

On Monday January 15, I am sitting South. East passes and I take some deep breaths with this hand:

♠ T A 10-card suit and almost solid!

▼ 42 I have 10 playing tricks in clubs and 3 losers.


♦ Hoping partner will have either ♠A or ♥A, I bid 5C,

♣ AKQT986432 which, by the Rule of 2&3, promises only 9 playing

tricks when vulnerable.

West passed and partner (Colin) confidently bid 6C!!

West made the obvious lead of ♠K:



Won with $\triangle A$, 2xhearts discarded on the A and K, and trumps drawn in 1 round. Making 13!

Interestingly, the contract can be held to 11 tricks if EW can find the highly unlikely defence of ∇K lead, overtaken with ∇A , and a ∇ return ruffed by West.

Also, the best making contract is 6NT – West can lead the ♥K but then has to switch, and South can take the next 12 tricks. At the other table West overcalled 5S and was doubled – 500 to NS, but not as good as 1390!

In the 35 years since I learned to play, I don't remember ever holding a hand with a 10xcard single-suiter – no wonder because the probability is only 0.000017 and one third of this if you consider the specific 10-2-1-0 distribution. (*Last month it was also Board 10 that rated a Grand Slam mention!*)

STATE MIXED PAIRS

Thursday February 17, all day

A little bit of history:

Our Club Mixed Pairs, for which there is a trophy, used to be one of the 6 Championship Events that Clubs can conduct each year. It was first won in 1988 by Dorothy (Maclean) Berzins and John White. 2021 winners were Christine Hadaway and Martin Johnson.

The State Mixed Pairs is/was an event for which Clubs run qualifying sessions. In the past we did not always conduct these, but just sent the winners of the Club Mixed Pairs or simply nominated available pairs. Since 2014 we have conducted a SMP qualifying event which attracts a higher rating of red masterpoints, and the winners of this become our Club Mixed Pairs Champions.

And now to the present:

When you play on Thursday 17, you not only have the chance of becoming a Club Champion, but also of representing us at the NSWBA over the weekend of May 28 & 29. You may then qualify for the State Final or for the Country Mixed Pairs Final.

To do this you must **PRE-ENTER!** So far there are only 3 pairs entered, so please do this soon. Contact Julie Sadler with any questions.

At Feb 5 this stood at 136 (87 Home and 49 Associate). This represents 82% of last years' members. About 5 or 6 are still expected to rejoin.

PAULINE EVANS MEMORIAL TROPHY

Who was Pauline Evans? A mother of 5, she managed to play bridge at the highest level, representing both Queensland and NSW many times. She also represented Australia as both a member and Captain of the National Women's team. Pauline regularly directed bridge tournaments and was regarded as an excellent teacher.

Not long after being diagnosed with multiple myeloma, Pauline and her husband Jim moved to the Central Coast and in January 2018 she joined CCLCBC.

Anyone that played against her on a Friday at our club would have been impressed with her good humour, friendliness and helpfulness – but few would have realised how famous she was!

Sadly, we were not to have her company long as she died in October 2019, aged 73.

In March, 2021, the North Shore Bridge Club held the Pauline Evans Swiss Pairs Congress at East Lindfield. Prizes and trophies were donated by the Evans family.

This year at the 60th Gold Coast Congress the Restricted Teams trophy will be dedicated to Pauline's memory. Jim Evans has sponsored this and donated prize money.

Not long after Pauline's death Jim contacted our Committee about a suitable way to remember Pauline. Because she was always so supportive of new players it was decided to create a red point event for players with under 100 masterpoints. Jim donated funds for a perpetual trophy and it was planned to conduct this new event in August last year.

Well, you know what happened.....

Now it is being conducted on **Monday, March 7, 2022**. What an honour it would be to be the first winners of this trophy!

Make your plans now. Only players with less than 100 masterpoints at January 1, 2022 can compete and there will be no side game. So if you usually play with someone who has more than 100 masterpoints, you need to politely dump them for March 7.
