COMING RED POINT EVENTS

1. ZELDA OVERHALL CUP – Thursday, September 9

Originally called the Patron's Cup, this was first won in 1991 by Eileen and Martin Smeyers. Sadly, there was no winner in 2009 as no eligible pair entered – let's not have that happen again!

This is a red point even, but the overall winner does not usually win the trophy. Why? Because:

The trophy is won by the best Regional* (or below) pair

If your ranking qualifies you to compete, then you need to play with another eligible player. Thursday may not be your regular day, and you may not be able to play with your regular partner – he/she will understand this annual exception.

To find a suitable partner, refer to the current ABF list which you will find in the 'Recap' folder on the trolley – or see the notice board for a list. If you are unsure of asking someone, then talk to Jan Wheeler or another committee member.

This event is designed for lower ranked players, and we have 117 eligible members, so we could hope for 8 tables of eligible players, as well as those of higher rankings. There is also a Special Prize for the best Local** (or below) pair for which 98 of the above are eligible. So, no excuses

2. SPRING PAIRS – Friday September 17

3. INTERCLUB TEAMS – Thursday, September 23

Arrange your team and enter before 4pm, Monday September 20. This is a great day with drinks and nibbles at the end. Many top players regard Teams bridge more highly than Pairs as you don't have to take risks for a 'top'. For example – in Pairs, 3NT making 10 tricks for 430 beats 4H making 10 tricks for 420, but in teams these scores are equal because Victory Points are awarded on a compressed scale. Other teams strategies to remember:

DO bid your games, especially if vulnerable

DO double for penalties at the game level if you think you have been robbed

DO NOT double for penalties at low levels – if they make it, you lose too much

DO NOT make silly sacrifices so that you are doubled – scores of -1100 or worse lose matches

COLIN'S CLAIM TO FAME

Coffs Coast (Gold) Congress – Open Teams: Match 4 - Board 24

I held ♠AK, ♥AKQ7, ♠KQT, ♠A765 and MFP sitting West opened the bidding with "three diamonds". Being alive and awake I counted the tricks – seven diamonds, two spades, three hearts and one club which makes thirteen.

I did have the sense to check that she actually had the diamond ace and received a favourable reply so I bid seven diamonds.

As expected, North lead a diamond, won on the table and followed by another high diamond to which both defenders followed. Suddenly there appeared a small crack in the foundations – partner had been a little (f)risky and bid with a six card suit.

Very careful play followed and then came the card that had to be played – the club queen towards the A765. North played the two and partner played low and FORTUNATELY the 50/50 finesse worked and the queen held the trick. The full hand:

♦QT987 Dlr - W**♥**986 Nil Vul **♦**52 **♣**K82 **♦**54 ♠AΚ **v**2 **♥**AKO7 ♦AJ8643 **♦**KOT **♣**OJ94 ♣A765 **♦**J632 **♥**T543 **♦**97 **♣**T3

Across the field, only 14 out of 76 teams bid and made a grand slam: 7NT x 3 and 7D x 11.

Editor's Note: Colin would have to go one better! In Match 1, Board 10 against the Paul Lavings team, Colin held ♠A87654, ♥8, ♦7, ♣A9654 and opened 2H, showing 2 suits of the same colour.

Holding ♠KJ, ♥A95, ♠AJ83, ♠KQJ7 (19 HCP) I made the strong enquiry of 2NT. The response was 3S showing a maximum (8-10) and the black suits. 4NT (Key-Card Blackwood on spades) produced 5H showing 2 controls.

Since I held the SK, Colin must hold the 2 missing Aces. I bid 6C, making 7 because of the 2 singletons in dummy. At the other table they only bid 4S (making 12), a gain of 12 Imps to us.

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Less than half the field bid slams: 7C x 4, 6S x 8, 6C x 23.
