#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### Items from September 7 and 21 committee meetings

- As requested at the AGM, the Stand-by policy has been reviewed and updated. The full document appears below
- A draft copy of the AGM minutes has been emailed to members
- Two 'Feel Friendly Factors' have been introduced.
  - 1. A 'Lucky Draw' for a free game at every session for approximately two months. There is no compulsion for fun only
  - 2. When the number of boards to be played is suitable and if there is no lengthy sit-out, a short afternoon tea break will be held. We hope this will give members a few minutes' socialising
- Sixteen Bridgemate II devices have been purchased. Colin and Ronnie are in charge of setting them up, training Directors and managing a staged introduction
- Name Badges will be provided to Beginning players after their first 3 months. Other members may purchase a badge for \$6 (half the actual cost). Put your name on the list on the Notice Board
- Di March, Colin and I are developing next year's Program Wendy Mitchell

#### STAND-BY POLICY AND JOB DESCRIPTION

#### Stand-by Policy

The club policy is to provide a stand-by for members coming without a partner so that they are assured of a game.

While there is no limit to the number of times a member may play with the stand-by, every attempt will be made by the Partnership Arranger to find a suitable partner for that member. Also, if a second member needs a partner, it is the stand-by who does not play.

A stand-by is not available for red point events. The remuneration for a stand-by is \$15 per session. No table fees are paid if the stand-by is required to play.

#### Stand-by Job Description

The stand-by must arrive at least 15 minutes before the game commences to help the director set up for the session in accordance with the director's wishes. If the stand-by is late the fee he/she receives will be reduced 50%.

The stand-by is responsible for collecting the table fees, completing the relevant details on the 'Daily Record of Table Fees', checking that the monies and free games balance, and signing for their payment.

A stand-by should ensure the person they are to play with enjoys the game and the day. The stand-by should play the system of their partner as far as they are able.

The stand-by must not refuse to play with a member. If this does occur the person may not be used as a standby again.

The stand-by, in accordance with any request from the director, may assist in setting up for the bridge session. If the standby does play, he/she should assist in packing up the cloths, table nos., food etc.

It is the responsibility of the stand-by to notify the member of the executive committee who is responsible for stand-bys if he/she is unable to attend on their nominated day. If that person is not available notify another member. Only arrange your own stand-by if no committee member is available. This is VERY important — and the director must be informed.

#### Rules, as they relate to directors and the use of a stand-by

- 1. A director may opt to play with a partner on a regular basis. In this case the committee provides a stand-by:
- The stand-by if not needed, will go home
- If for some reason the stand-by does not arrive and a member arrives
  without a partner, the Director, at his/her discretion, may choose to
  play with that member, have his/her partner play with the member, or
  send the member home. (See below)
- 2. A director may opt to have a stand-by, who if not needed, plays with the director.
- The director will not play if the stand-by is needed.
- 3. A director may opt to be his/her own stand-by.
- The director will play if needed. In this situation the director receives the stand-by money.

N.B. If a director operating under rules 2/3 decided to play with a specific partner he/he must notify a member of the executive committee so that a stand-by may be arranged. In principle NO player goes home without having a game. If in extreme circumstances a member has to go home without a game, the Director of the day is to issue a free game card (from the Director's supply) and the Director is to write a report of the reason and place this in the President's tray.
