Dorothy has mentioned some of the Central Coast participants in her article which follows.


#### **Gold Coast 2014 Blues**

With weird distributions many hands were extremely hard to bid and to play. Take this example from Match 4 Board 19.

Would you open this hand? Sitting South you hold

- ◆ OJT83
- **♦** 6432
- ♣ O762

Well one South opened 2 Spades and West bid 3 Hearts. After North bid 4 Spades, East (Di Coats) did well to bid 5 Hearts. South now bid 5 Spades and there the contract stayed.



East West can make 6 Hearts but without the advantage of seeing all hands both East and West were worried about their Club holding and, for West, a possible Spade loser.

At our table south (Dorothy) did not open 2 Spades so West opened 1 Heart. North bid 2 Spades and East went 3 Spades showing heart support and a void or singleton Spade. South went 4 spades and East went 5 Hearts. The result was 5 Hearts making 13 on a Spade lead (the clubs going away on the Diamonds) for -710 and +150 for 5 spades going down 3. We were not alone. Only 40 % of the field bid 6 Hearts and such was one misunderstanding that **East/West played in 4 Spades doubled going down for 1700.** 

Even when we got the bidding right the playing skill did not match up. Take this hand in **Match 6 Board 24.** The bidding opened by West who bid 4 Spades, Pass, Pass. South (Dorothy) held



Dorothy bid 6 Clubs, the lead was the K of spades and Dummy went down

★ 3 ▼ T642 ★ KT9832 ★ 95

I won with the A of Spades ruffed a spade with the 5 of clubs and ran the 9 of Clubs, planning on getting rid of the last spade on the diamonds. After drawing trumps I led the A of diamonds and had to go down 2. This was the full hand:

North

♠ 3

♥ T642

♠ KT9832

♣ 95

West

♠ KQT9876

♥ QJ93

♦ -----
♣ 86

South

♠ AJ4

♥ A

♦ AJ5

♣ AKJT73

To make the hand you need to ruff the two spades allowing East to overuff with the Q of clubs – then you have to lead the 5 of Diamonds to the K and finesse the Jack on the way back. Of course it is easy to see now but with no other entry to the Diamonds (after not having ruffed the second spade) it is hard to lead and block the suit. At the other table South was in 5 Clubs making so that Board was an overall loss of -500.

Di Coats and Jan Clarke did well in the Weekend Match Point Pairs coming 17<sup>th</sup> out of 144 Pairs.

Marie Purkiss and Toni Dixon did brilliantly to come 8<sup>th</sup> in the one day Swiss Pairs while Dorothy and Peter only managed 54<sup>th</sup> position out of 152.

Gary and Sally Clarke's Team came an impressive 14<sup>th</sup> out of 196 Teams in the Open, while Lorraine Lindsay's Team came a very creditable 45<sup>th</sup>.

Hope Tomlinson, Barry Foster, Jenny Buckley and Martin Johnson came 5<sup>th</sup> out of 68 in the Restricted Teams. Well done. everyone.

Fortunately the weather was fantastic (unlike last year) so that helped to ease the pain.
