#### PERSONAL PROFILE

#### **Wendy Mitchell**

(It was mentioned that I hadn't written a profile recently, so in the absence of other suggestion/offers, here is mine.)

Born in Sydney, we moved from Stanmore to live with my paternal grandfather who ran a nursery, specialising in chrysanthemums. Schooling was at Turramurra North and Artarmon Opportunity primary schools, Hornsby Girls High and University of NSW where I completed a BSc (Hons) in Textile Technology. My main outside interest was hockey – played for and captained High School teams, NSW State Schoolgirls and UNSW and played in NSW Juniors. My first husband and I met at UNSW through hockey.

After one year as Quality Control Officer at Australian Woollen Mills, married Carl (a metallurgist) and moved to Groote Eylandt in NT for two years where I worked for BHP as a chemist assaying manganese. This was followed by overseas travel and a year as a typist for Thomas Cook Travel in London where our daughter was born.

Returned to Melbourne for two years where our son was born, then back to Groote for 8 years. This was a busy life full of duties of motherhood, staff/manager's wife, part-time Bank Agent, Rent-a-Car book-keeper/driver, High School Maths/Science teacher and Diploma of Education by correspondence. Heavily involved in the local CWA from its inauguration and represented Northern Territory at the Conference of International Country Women of the World in Perth.

Back in Melbourne, I taught Maths, Science and Computing at Ringwood Technical School. Divorced, moved to Sydney, taught at Granville Boys HS for 20 years. Had stints as Relieving Head Teacher PDHPE, then Art/Music. Was appointed as HT Mathematics, later transferred to HT Administration and also relieved as Deputy Principal (Curriculum).

Met and married Danny after learning bridge. Widowed, I married Colin, whom Danny and I had known. Transferred to Lisarow HS as HT Administration and taught just Mathematics, relinquishing my HSC marking position as a Judge for the computing subject IPT.

I grew up with lots of simple card games. My parents and aunt and uncle played Solo passionately – I was only allowed to hold a hand occasionally for a few minutes. Husband Carl and his friends played bridge – I was expected to make the supper and tried but could not understand the Culbertson version of the game with half-tricks and quick tricks from Hoyle's Book of Rules.

In Sydney in 1986 I enrolled in Beginner lessons with John Newman. I first learned 4-card majors up-the-line, progressed to 4-card majors down-the-line and eventually converted to 5-card majors. I played ACOL with Danny, followed by Standard American, Relay Precision learned from the late Australian representative player Don Evans and then a simpler relay system from John Newman called Nemesis! Bridge congresses and holidays were a large part of my life with Danny. Colin and I play a Standard version melded from various features of the systems we played with our previous bridge partners/ spouses. He and I enjoy playing bridge wherever we travel, both at home and overseas.

All of this gave me a love of systems and bidding theory which I took to readily – good card play and defence came more slowly. On retirement I intended to never teach again, but was enthused after teaching bridge first to children at Gosford Primary and then to adults at Kincumber Community College and Henry Kendall Retirement Village – all of whom **wanted** to learn. Teaching beginners and conducting Intermediate workshops on cruises was another different experience as everything is condensed into one-hour sessions. Lastly, I have run Beginners and Improvers lessons at CCLCBC since 2008. *WM*

#### THE HOLDUP IN NO-TRUMP PLAY

With North the dealer, the bidding is Pass, Pass, 1D, 1NT, All Pass. North leads  $\forall J$ . South plays  $\forall A$ ,  $\forall Q$ , which West wins with  $\forall K$ . West cashes 3xdiamonds ending in dummy with  $\mathbf{Q}$  and runs  $\mathbf{A}$ 10, covered by  $\mathbf{Q}$ , won by West's  $\mathbf{A}$ . Now  $\mathbf{J}$ , won by South's  $\mathbf{K}$ .

South is left with:  $\blacktriangle$  AKT2  $\blacktriangledown$  --  $\blacklozenge$  J  $\clubsuit$  2 and dummy with:  $\spadesuit$  9765  $\blacktriangledown$  --  $\spadesuit$  76

There are 5xhearts outstanding and North's lead has promised ♥10 and ♥9 or ♥8. Why didn't North lead partner's opening suit? Presumably because he has an entry to the hearts.

So, South cashed the  $\bullet J$  (on which North discarded a spade) and underled the spades with  $\bullet 2$ . North won and cashed four more heart tricks. South had to discard the  $\bullet A$  and  $\bullet K$  but declarer was kept to 5 tricks.

Declarer's full hand was: ▲ J83 ♥ K53 ♦ AK4 ♣ AJ98. If declarer 'holds up' the ♥K at trick 2, the maximum possible 6 tricks are made as South had only a doubleton heart and North with ♠Q4 ♥JT9874 ♦732 ♣54 does not have a second entry to establish the heart suit.

#### CLUB PAIRS REPORT

Twenty pairs pre-entered this event. On the day two pairs were emergency withdrawals and disappointingly, one pair was a no-show. One pair arrived without notice. Although a standby pair had been arranged, after some delay the movement was reorganised to operate as a nine table Mitchell with eighteen pairs.

In the second week, a movement called an Interwoven Howell was conducted, where every North-South pair from Session 1 played each other and similarly every East-West pair played each other. Hence, after two sessions, each pair had played every other pair in the whole field - the recommended set-up and the fairest possible.

#### **GNOT REPORT**

Of the twelve teams competing, only five registered as contenders. Some were entered as five- and six- player teams. Two of these did indeed play all their members, but three did not.

Confusion arose when the Regional Supplementary GNOT Regulations were applied, as masterpoints were then shared among all team members, whether or not they had played. After considerable email discussion with the Regional and State Organisers and the State Tournament Adviser this unreasonable situation was corrected.

It is expected that next year these regulations will be re-worded so that players earn only the masterpoints for the sessions in which they have played. However, a player named as part of a qualifying team can proceed to the Regional Final even if they did not play!
